

## **Appendix 8**

## **Zonta International Conventions**

The highest authority of Zonta International is the annual convention. The purpose of the convention has been described in the Bylaws in almost the same words since 1919.

In 1980, the wording was: "Zonta International shall hold a biennial Convention for the purpose of determining the policies of Zonta International, of receiving reports of officers and committees, of electing officers and the Nominating Committee, and for any other business that may arise".

In 1990, this was expanded to read:

Zonta International shall hold a biennial Convention to present an informative, motivational, and educational program; ; elect the International Officers and Directors and members of the International Nominating Committee; receive reports; vote on proposed amendments to the Bylaws; vote on resolutions and goals that establish the International Service Projects and program, and give general direction of Zonta International; and for any other business that may properly come before the Convention assembly (Zonta International Bylaws 1990, Article IX).

The current purpose of the convention, as described in Article X Section 1 of the 2018 Governing Documents, is identical except for the addition of "shall determine the policies of Zonta International" as the second purpose.

The right to vote is a privilege for Zonta International Board members, Past International Presidents and club delegates. Each club is entitled to a delegate. From 1931, clubs with a membership which exceeded 50 members were entitled to one additional vote. This number was changed to 40 in 1982 and to 30 in 2014.

A club unable to send a delegate to convention may now be represented by proxy. For a period, clubs were allowed only one proxy vote, but are now entitled to their total votes by proxy.

The table below lists the year and location of each convention. Those held outside North America are highlighted.
