

Chapter 15

District 11 – North America

Since 1920, Zonta International has grouped clubs by district. The following is information on the formation of District 11. In 2018, District 11 had 39 clubs in seven states in the United States and in Puerto Rico, the British Virgin Islands and The Bahamas.¹

District 11 Service Projects²

Members in Area 06 of District 11 dedicate time to the Birthing Kits - 6 for 6! Project.

A birthing kit contains a large piece of plastic for the mother to lie on, iodine swabs and soap, latex gloves, gauze squares, a cord scissor, and two umbilical cord clamps.

The Zonta Club of Sanibel-Captiva held its first birthing kit assembly day event on January 26 in 2008 at the Sanibel Library. Over 60 volunteers worked most of the day rolling, folding, inserting, checking and counting to create over a thousand kits. Volunteers included Zonta members from Sanibel, Fort Myers, and Bonita Springs, as well as prospective members and volunteers from the Sanibel community, volunteers from SWFAS (one of the club's local partners), midwives from the Foundation for Women's Health in Naples, and even a vacationing mother and daughter. With the support of Sanibel Library staff, an assembly line was set up in the library meeting rooms and some 1,300 kits were assembled. Supplies were provided and delivered by Lee Sar, a local medical supply distribution company, which has contributed to many international missions and will contribute supplies to other local clubs.

In addition to the January 2008 Sanibel-Captiva assembly day, 1,000 kits were produced in 2007 by the Sarasota and Bonita Springs clubs, the Zonta clubs of Bonita Springs and Naples co-hosted an assembly day, the Punta Gorda/Port Charlotte clubs held assembly days, and additional kits were produced in Sanibel in the Spring of 2008.

While individual clubs may have hosted assembly days, this has very much been an Area project and the goal to complete 6,000 kits in the first four months of 2008 was achieved.

The birthing kit project was adopted by Zontians in District 11 as a result of work with Miracles in Action, an organization based in Collier County which works to improve the quality of life in Guatemala and other Latin American countries. The kits were shipped free of charge by American Airlines and distributed by local in-country nonprofits to midwife organizations for use in the lowest income areas of Guatemala, many of which have few or no health care facilities available to local women.

Area 06 Zontians have also worked together to install plaques honoring Amelia Earhart in three area airports in Sarasota, Naples and Fort Myers by sharing the costs of plaques and supporting and attending ceremonies in each of the airports³.

Timeline of district history highlights.

1936: Zonta International's District Plan included District I with Region A and B, District II with Region A and B, District III with Region A and B, and District VI and District VII.

The Zonta Club of Atlanta in Georgia belonged to District II, Region B.

1946: Clubs from Alabama, Florida, Georgia and Tennessee belonged to District III, Region C.

A district VIII might have existed from 1946 to 1947 with Mary Wood Davis from Memphis, Tennessee as governor. She is listed as a member of the Zonta International Board from 1946 to 1947. District 11 listed her as governor from 1946 to 1947 and Gladys Shaftall from Jacksonville, Florida as governor from 1947 to 1949.

1947: In a major re-districting, District XI was established for clubs in:

- Alabama
- Florida
- Georgia
- Mississippi
- North Carolina
- South Carolina
- Tennessee

District XI was founded with 11 clubs from: Alabama (one club), Florida (eight clubs), Georgia (one club), and Tennessee (one club).

1952: 16 clubs, including one in Mississippi.

1957: 17 clubs.

1960: 25 clubs. By this date, clubs had been chartered in North Carolina and South Carolina.

1962: 28 clubs.

1966: Puerto Rico joined the district.

1974: 37 clubs in four areas, designated as Areas 01, 02, 03 and 04.

1979: 43 clubs in five areas.

1981: 52 clubs organized in five areas. Area 01 had 11 clubs, Area 02 13 clubs, Area 03 14 clubs, Area 04 ten clubs and Area 05 four clubs.

1982: The Bahamas and Jamaica joined District XI Area 03.⁴ (Jamaica was lost in 1984.)

1990: Zonta International Board decided to replace Roman numerals with Arabic numerals. District XI became District 11.

63 clubs and 1,944 members.⁵

1993: 62 clubs in six areas. Area 01 had 11 clubs, Area 02 12 clubs, Area 03 16 clubs, Area 04 nine clubs, Area 05 five clubs and Area 06 nine clubs.

2000: The Zonta Club of Dominicana in the Dominican Republic joined District 11 because District 22, the Central American district, was closed. (The club disbanded in 2003.)

2002 – 2008: 43 clubs in six Areas.

2010: The British Virgin Islands joined District 11.

2016: The district included the Southeast United States, the Bahamas, Puerto Rico, and the British Virgin Islands. However, no clubs have been chartered in the Bahamas or Puerto Rico since 1997, Alabama since 1979, Mississippi since 1977, and Tennessee since 1965.

40 clubs in 10 states, organized in six areas:

- The Bahamas were in Area 03
- The British Virgin Islands were in Area 03
- Puerto Rico was in Area 05
- Alabama was in Area 01
- Florida clubs were in Areas 03, 04 and 06
- Georgia was in Area 02
- Mississippi was in Area 01
- North Carolina was in Area 02
- South Carolina was in Area 02
- Tennessee was in Area 01.

2017: District 11 sustained a loss of 65 members between 2016 and 2017. The district had 781 members in 40 clubs.

2018: 818 members.⁶

2019: 740 members.⁷
