

Chapter 17

District 15 - North America¹

Since 1920, Zonta International has grouped clubs by district. The following is information on the formation of District 15. As of 2018, District 15 had a total of 36 clubs in one state in the United States (Michigan) and one province in Canada (Ontario).

The history of District 15 dates from 1919 with the founding of the Zonta Club of Detroit, one of the nine clubs that established the Confederation of Zonta Clubs in November 1919.

District 15 Conferences:

Traditionally, District 15 had held an annual Fall Conference. In 2014, members were surveyed to determine if this tradition should continue. Most members responded that a one-day Governor's Summit in even years may reduce the cost to clubs and members and allow more to attend the international conventions also held during the even years. In 2016, the first one-day Governor's Summit was held in Roscommon.²

District Service and Advocacy Projects³

Due to its location on the Great Lakes, Michigan's international border is on water. Consequently, it is one of the top U.S. states for trafficking of persons. Advocacy to stop trafficking has been a noteworthy focus of District 15. During the 2010–2012 biennium, district Zontians developed a poster in three of the languages common in Michigan (English, Spanish and Arabic) and placed them at several highway rest areas. This was precipitated by a partnership developed with the Department of Transportation. In 2016, laws were passed requiring information about human trafficking to be placed at bus stops, highway rest areas and passenger train stations. The Michigan Department of Transportation approached District 15 for permission to use the posters they had developed.

During the 2012–2014 biennium, district members worked with *Handbags for Hope*, a service organization in Detroit, to collect unwanted handbags and items to go into them with a goal of collecting 400. The generosity of district clubs resulted in over 4,000 handbags being collected for the organization. The organization placed items of greatest need in the handbags for women who escape domestic violence situations and leave their home with only the clothes on their back.

During the 2014–2016 Biennium, District 15 Zontians initiated a partnership with a film producer, Sophia Cruz, to make *Creating4Change*. The film showcases four women who are using creative ways to help other women, particularly those in domestic violence situations. This is done through a variety of expressions from dancing and painting to making clothes.

Significant Zontians from District 15⁴

Ethel M. Francis (Zonta International President 1925–1926)

Zonta Club of Detroit, Michigan.

Ethel was a charter member of the Detroit club and was a Zonta member for more than 40 years. She was a pioneer in the advertising business and headed her own agency in the early 1900s. Later in life, she joined the staff of *Detroit News* as the only woman on the advertising staff.

Louise C. Grace (Zonta International President 1946–1948)

Zonta Club of Detroit, Michigan.

Theme: "Action for World Peace"

The first international service project for Zonta occurred during Louise's biennium. She was committed to promoting the image of Zonta as an organization committed to peace. Under her leadership, Zonta voiced strong support for the newly formed United Nations. During her biennium, 30 clubs were organized – the largest growth in membership in Zonta's history.

Audra E. Francis (Zonta International President 1958–1960)

Zonta Club of Saginaw, Michigan.

Theme: "Zonta Opens the Door to World Friendship Through Service".

Audra was recruited to the Zonta Club of Saginaw with the classification of "homemaker" in an organization composed of executives in business and the professions. She led a delegation of 50 Zontians to Copenhagen and, with the support of the European Zontians, expressed an effort to clear the concentration camps established in World War II.

Edna Nairn (Zonta International President 1966–1968)

Theme: "View from the Top".

Timeline of district history highlights

1947: Clubs were part of District 05 when District 15 was founded in 1947, comprising clubs from Ohio, Michigan and Western Ontario.

When clubs were organized in Kentucky, they became part of District 05.

1968: District 05 had 50 clubs with a membership of 2,064. District 05 voted to divide into two districts. Permission was granted by Zonta International and was effective from 1970.

1970: At the Fall Conference in Toledo, Ohio, District 05 was divided into:

- District 5a, hosting clubs in Michigan and western Ontario
- District 5b, hosting clubs in Ohio and Kentucky. Clubs in northern and western West Virginia petitioned to become part of District 5b. They were welcomed into the district.

1972: The Zonta International Board decided all Districts were to be named with Roman numerals:

- District 5a became District XV, comprising clubs located in Michigan and Western Ontario, Canada.
- District 5b became District V, comprising clubs in Ohio, Kentucky and West Virginia.

1974: 31 clubs in two areas, designated as Areas 01 and 02

1978: 34 clubs in three areas, designated as Areas 01, 02 and 03.

1980: 36 clubs in three areas.

1990: The Zonta International Board changed the designation from Roman numerals into Arabic numerals; District XV became District 15.

45 clubs and 1,920 members.5

1995: 32 clubs in three areas. Area 01 had 14 clubs, Area 02 had 12 clubs, Area 03 had six clubs.

2002: 47 clubs in four areas.

2007–2010: District 15 held strong with 35 - 40 clubs for most of its history. The U.S. recession of 2007-2010 hit the auto industry quite hard, which is the main manufacturing business of Michigan supporting a variety of complementary businesses. This resulted in the loss of about 200 - 300 members and the loss of eight clubs between 2005 and 2015.

In the twenty years between 1995 and 2015, there was very little club growth. Of the three clubs established in this time, only one remained truly viable in 2018.

2008: 45 clubs in four areas.

2010: District 15 welcomed their first male members in the newly chartered Zonta Club of Troy-South Oakland.⁶

2016: 37 clubs in four areas.

2017: One club was chartered in Michigan. Since 1978, no clubs have been chartered in Ontario.

2018: 808 members.

2019: 698 members.
